On 12th March, a group of students visited the Kenya Medical Research Institute (KEMRI) in Kisumu for an educational tour. The visit provided an opportunity to explore various specialized laboratories and gain insights into ongoing medical research. The students were welcomed by KEMRI researchers and taken through different labs, including the mosquito breeding lab, malaria research lab, entomology lab, and the TB testing and research lab. Each of these labs plays a critical role in disease surveillance, control, and medical advancements.

A major highlight of the visit was learning about the research on malaria and tuberculosis. In the mosquito breeding and entomology labs, students observed the life cycle of mosquitoes and how they are studied to understand malaria transmission. The malaria research lab provided insights into efforts to develop better treatments and preventive measures for the disease. Similarly, the TB testing and research lab demonstrated modern diagnostic methods used to detect tuberculosis and develop effective treatment regimens.

Additionally, the students had the opportunity to learn about COVID-19 research, including how different strains of the virus are investigated. The researchers explained the process of testing vaccines, ensuring their safety and effectiveness. The visit was highly informative and gave the students a deeper appreciation of the role of scientific research in combating infectious diseases. Overall, the trip to KEMRI-Kisumu was a valuable learning experience, inspiring many students to consider careers in medical research

I would spend my ideal weekend either enjoying quality time with my family or taking long rides with my biker colleagues.


What is your favourite song? Fear Is A Liar by Zach Williams.

Nathalie - Recognise how fortunate you are to be in such a beautiful learning



Karine - Please appreciate the wonderful opportunity you have to learn, grow, and explore. Make the most of it.


