


# Yr 2 Trip to Lake Nakuru



On Thursday, we visited Nakuru National Park, where we experienced its rich biodiversity. We observed a variety of wildlife, including warthogs, zebras, buffaloes, impalas, Grant's gazelles, elands, Thomson's gazelles, waterbucks, numerous giraffes, and a distant rhino. A few hippos playfully surfaced and disappeared, adding to the excitement. At the lake, we marveled at the diverse birdlife, with our guide informing us that the park hosts 450 species, including migratory birds. We took a break at the waterfall before heading to Lion Hill for lunch. The children had a memorable experience, especially when they got to hold a buffalo skull.













# President's Award Bronze Expedition - Ngong






